GUIDELINES FOR POSTER PRESENTATION

A poster presentation comprises of a visual display on a poster board of the highlights of a project. The poster will be available for viewing by attendees during all hours the poster hall is open.

Measurements: Each presenter is assigned a space which measures: 36 inches (91.44 cm) wide and 48 inches high.

Mounting: Posters should be designed and constructed so they can be attached to the poster board with double sided tape, which will be found at each poster board. Additional pins may be requested at the meeting registration desk.

SUGGESTIONS FOR PREPARING POSTERS

Content:

The poster could show the full title of your submission.

Text could be brief and well organized, presenting only enough data to support your presentation.

The text could make clear the significance of your project.

Design:

A clear, simple, uncluttered arrangement is the most attractive and the easiest to read.


Color could be used sparingly, to provide contrast. The featured parts of the poster can be highlighted with warm colors, and the less important parts can be done in cool colors. Some suggestions for color combinations are as follows: Green on white, red on white, black on white, blue on white, white on blue, and white on black. Illustrations should be simple and eye-catching, with pictures of the project in high resolution. Photos should be enlarged enough to show relevant detail.

Standard computer printouts usually are not effective on posters, because the type is too small and the lines are too thin to be seen from a distance.

Round Table International understands that 41 International is their past and their future and 41 International understands that Round Table International is their past and their future. Because of this common understanding both Organisations undertake to work together.

**10 point action guidance plan
for RTI & 41 INTERNATIONAL and their members**

1. Both Organizations should promote each other and write articles in their respective official means of electronic communications & publications like Newsletter, Facebook Page, magazine and their Web-Pages and Directories.
2. Round Tables to issue a letter of recognition of the services rendered to the society as a Tabler and 41 to issue a letter of invitation to retiring Tablers.
3. A day demarcated to celebrate 41ers day and Round Table day in the respective clubs.
4. Regular joint Board meetings of RT and 41 at National and International level.
Member countries to ensure that local RT and 41 Clubs meet on a regular basis.
5. President of both Organisations to be invited with partner to participate in the AGM as guest with accommodation and registration paid for the President and when possible for his partner. This invitation to be followed by the both Organisation's members for their Presidents at National and Local level.
6. Round Table projects to be supported by 41 Clubs and all 41 Club community projects to be routed through Round Tables. Also to encourage members to identify common charity projects.
7. 41 Club members to make their children, grandchildren, friend's children join Round Tables.
8. Mutually help in forming or reviving clubs in countries.
9. To initiate a common International focus/community service.
10. The MOU to be reviewed every 2 years by the Boards of RTI and 41 International to see if any changes need to be made.

HILL OF CROSSES- LITHUANIA



No one really knows when the first crosses started appearing on this small hill just outside of the city of Siauliai in Lithuania, but some trace them back to uprisings against Russian rule in 1831 or 1863. Over the years, it has been a place for Lithuanians to pray for peace and their country and to memorialize loved ones who passed away. During the Soviet occupation, it also served as a peaceful sign of resistance to Soviet rule. The Soviets tried to bulldoze the site three times, but the Hill of Crosses endured.

In September 1993, Pope John Paul II visited the Hill and left a cross as a symbol of love, peace, hope and sacrifice.

Today, it is estimated that over 100,000 crosses from all over the world have been placed on the Hill.
